## <u>OPINION</u>

Continental Telephone Corporation (of which Continental Telephone Company of California and Colfax Telephone Exchange are subsidiaries) seeks authority to control Redwood Empire Telephone Company, which owns and operates public utility telephone systems serving portions of the Counties of Kern, Kings, Monterey, San Luis Obispo and Sonoma.

Applicant proposes to control Redwood Empire Telephone Company through acquisition of at least 90% of the latter's outstanding voting stock. The transaction would be accomplished through the offer by Continental Telephone Corporation to exchange one share of its common stock for each of the outstanding shares of common stock of Redwood Empire Telephone Company. In addition, applicant would offer to acquire the outstanding shares of preferred stock of Redwood Empire Telephone Company by issuing in exchange therefor shares of common stock having a market value approximately equal to the redemption price of such preferred stock.

After consideration the Commission finds that control of Redwood Empire Telephone Company by Continental Telephone Corporation would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that the A.55361 LSC application should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary. The action taken herein shall not be construed as a finding of value of the stock of Redwood Empire Telephone Company. ORDER IT IS ORDERED that Continental Telephone Corporation may control Redwood Empire Telephone Company. The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
