(PUC Public Crossing No. BO-53.4) <u>OPINION</u> The County of Contra Costa (applicant) requests authority to construct a crossing at grade at Norris Canyon Road across the tracks of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company. The County of Contra Costa is the lead agency for this project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended, and on September 4, 1973, adopted on Environmental Impact Report. Notice of the application was published in the Commission's Daily Calendar on September 12, 1974. No protests have been received. A public hearing is not necessary. <u>FINDINGS</u> After consideration, the Commission finds: 1. Applicant should be authorized to construct a crossing at Norris Canyon Road at grade across Southern Pacific Transportation Company tracks in the County of Contra Costa at the location and substantially as shown by plans attached to the application. 2. Cost of constructing the crossing and automatic protection should be borne by the applicant. 3. Maintenance cost of the crossing should conform to General Order No. 72-B. Maintenance cost of the automatic protection should be borne by the applicant. - 1 -

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- 7. Construction plans of the crossing approved by the Southern Pacific Transportation Company, together with a copy of the agreement entered into between the parties involved, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction.
- 3. Maintenance of the crossing shall be in accordance with General Order No. 72-3. Maintenance cost of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant.
- 9. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if the above conditions are not complied with. This authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
