ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Decision No. 83032 dated June 25, 1974 directed Alton O. Hatley (Hatley), doing business as Western Distributors, to collect undercharges of \$8,062.84, pay a fine in the amount of the undercharges by September 15, 1974, and pay a punitive fine of \$1,000. The punitive fine has been paid. Hatley's attorney has informed the Commission that his client has been unable to collect the undercharges; that suit has been filed against the respondent debtors; and that his client sustained a loss of \$35,000 in 1973 and cannot pay the fine in the amount of the undercharges until the collections have been made. Based on those reasons, the attorney has requested an extension of time within which his client is required to pay the undercharge fine.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The time within which the fine specified in Ordering Paragraph 2 of Decision No. 83032 is required to be paid is extended to July 1, 1975.

2. In all other respects, Decision No. 83032 shall remain in full force and effect.
