This is an application by The Gray Line Tours Company (Gray Line) which seeks additional passenger stage corporation operating rights.

Gray Line presently conducts sight-seeing operations as a passenger stage corporation in southern California. It holds extensive operating rights. Gray Line seeks herein (1) authority to establish three additional nonexclusive pickup territories and (2) authority to institute a combined tour involving points of interest in its Anaheim-Buena Park territory.

The material issue presented herein is whether public convenience and necessity require granting the requested additional operating authority.

The verified application avers that since the establishment of Gray Line's currently authorized pickup territories additional prospective patronage has developed because of the construction of new hotels and motels outside of its authorized service area; that Gray Line has received numerous requests to provide service from those newly constructed hotels and motels; and that it would benefit the public and Gray Line if such service were authorized. The application also indicates that Gray Line's operating experience shows that the attraction of Knott's Berry Farm is not sufficiently great enough to justify a tour solely to that point. The application states that Gray Line has received requests for combined tours which include Knott's Berry Farm and other points of interest in the immediate vicinity. The application also seeks such authority.

Gray Line attached to the application a balance sheet as of June 30, 1973, a revenue and expense statement for the first six months of 1973 and a list of its operating equipment which would be used in the proposed service. These exhibits indicate that Gray Line has the ability, including financial ability, to operate the proposed service.

Copies of the application were served on the Southern California Rapid Transit District and the cities of Los Angeles, Inglewood, Hawthorne, El Segundo, Anaheim, and Buena Park. The Commission has received no protests to the application. The Commission makes the following findings and conclusion.

Findings of Fact

1. A public hearing is not necessary in this matter.

2. Gray Line has received requests to provide sight-seeing service to newly constructed hotels and motels in and about the cities of Inglewood, Hawthorne, and El Segundo.

3. Gray Line's operating experience indicates that the attraction of Knott's Berry Farm is not at the present time sufficiently great enough to justify a tour solely to that point.

4. Public convenience and necessity require that Gray Line be granted additional operating authority as hereinafter set forth.

5. Gray Line has the ability, including financial ability, to conduct operations under the authority hereafter granted.

6. With reasonable certainty the project involved in this proceeding will not have a significant effect on the environment. <u>Conclusion of Law</u>

The application should be granted as hereinafter set forth.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to The Gray Line Tours Company, a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 226 A. 54411 1mm

of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in revision of Appendix A of Decision No. 81036 as follows: Appendix A of Decision No. 81036 is amended by incorporating Original Page 11-A and First Revised Pages 3, 6, 8, 11, and 24 in revision of Original Pages 3, 6, 8, 11, and 24, respectively.

2. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicant shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the authority.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate granted. Applicant is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules administered by the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General. Order No. 98-Series, and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-Series.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
- (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79-Series and 98-Series.

(e) Applicant shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
