ORDER REVOKING FREIGHT FORWARDER CERTIFICATE

Transcon Lines, a corporation, possesses a certificate of public convenience and necessity pursuant to Section 1010 of the Public Utilities Code to conduct business as a freight forwarder of general commodities from and to various points in California.

James L. Welsh, Coordinator - Airfreight Sales, Transcon Lines, informed the Commission by letter that Transcon Lines discontinued all operations as an air freight forwarder on January 1, 1974, and requested that the necessary action be taken to reflect this fact.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that revocation of the certificate would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the freight forwarder certificate should be revoked.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Transcon Lines, a corporation, by Decision No. 79986 dated April 25, 1972, in Application No. 52921 is hereby revoked.
2. H. Scott Grevemberg, Issuing Officer, is hereby directed to cancel Transcon Lines California Intrastate Airfreight Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1, on file with the Commission, such cancellation to be made within ninety days after the effective date of

this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Transcon Lines or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to H. Scott Grevenberg, Issuing Officer, 1206 S. Maple Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90015.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
