O P I N I O N

Both the above mentioned applicants have filed applications for substantially the same type of transportation service (carrying passengers and baggage from Fresno to the China Peak Ski Area). Both applicants protest each others' request. The Commission being aware of the seasonal nature of the proposed operations at this time will grant temporary authority to each applicant with the provision that at a subsequent date the Commission will make a final determination as to these applications.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Temporary certificates of public convenience and necessity are granted to Herb Bauer's Sporting Goods, Inc., a corporation, and Jack Pieroni & Co. Ski & Sport, a corporation, authorizing them

to operate as passenger stage corporations, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in their respective applications.

2. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, applicants shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the authority.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicants shall file a written acceptance of the temporary certificates granted. Applicants are placed on notice that if they accept the temporary certificates they will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules administered by the California Highway Patrol, the rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 98-Series, and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 101-Series.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, applicants shall establish the authorized service and file tariffs and timetables, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the authorized service.
- (d) The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders Nos. 79-Series and 98-Series.

- (e) Applicants shall maintain their accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of their operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
