Application of Winfrad D. Breland to Increase rates from $\$ 2.10$ per xound trip to $\$ 2.75$ per round trip as set forth herein. Short notice is spocified - long hari from San Bernardino to Marine Coxps Base at Nebo, and an extension thereof to Yermo Marine Supply Center at Yermo, California.

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Applicant Winfred D. Breland, an individual, operating as a passengex stage comporation between San Bemardino, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, the Marine Corps Base at Nebo and the Yermo Supply Center at Yemm, requests approval to increase his roundtrip fares from $\$ 2.10$ to $\$ 2.75$, a gross anmal revenue increase of approximately $\$ 4,460$. The present round-trip fare of $\$ 2.10$ was authorized by Decision No. 72512 dated December 7, 1967.

Applicant contends the present fare is inadequate to give him a fair profit and that he is in fact operating at a loss. The application shows that for the year ended December 31, 1973 applicant had a net loss of $\$ 980$. Applicant owns two buses used in the operation: one, a 1960 Silver Eagle used on a daily basis and the other, a 1955 Flexible used as a standby. Applicant is an employee at one of the facilities and dxives the bus himself.

The Comission's staff made an investigation of applicant's operation and submitted a study, identified as Exhibit 1, showing the estimated results of applicant's operation for the year 1975 (Appendix A). The staff foum that applicant operated approximately 41,000 miles in the year 1974 and would operate the same miles in the rate year. In its investigation the staff foumd applicant was

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carrying 28 passengers per day in his round-trip service and took four hours to make the round trip. 3ased on 253 working days the staff estimates that the operating reveme for the year would be $\$ 15,020$, resulting in a loss of $\$ 2,200$ based on present fares but, If the proposed fares were instituted he would gross $\$ 19,480$ with a resulting profit of $\$ 2,260$, or an operating ratio of 92 percent after income taxes and a 9.9 percent rate of return. Expenses for the rate year include an allowance of $\$ 3,600$ per year for the service performed by applicane in driving the bus. Ensed on its study the staff recomenis that the application be granted. No protests to the application have been received.

After consideration the Comission finds that the increase in rates and charges authorized by this decision are justified and are reesonabie; and the present rates and charges, insofar as they differ from those prescribed by this decision, are for the future unjust and unreasonible. A public hearing on this application is not necessary.
ORDER

## IT IS ORCERED that:

1. Winfred D. Breland is authorized to establish the increased rates proposed in Application No. S51l2. Tariff publications authorized to be mede as a result of this order sball be filed not earlier than the effective ciste of this order and moy be made effective not earliex than ten dajs after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Comission and to the public.
2. The authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.
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3. In addition to the required posting and filing of tariffs, applicant shall give notice to the public by posting in its buses and terminals a printed explanation of its fares. Such notice shall be posted not less than five days before the effective date of the fare changes and shall remain posted for a period of not less than thirty days.
