OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, O. R. Thomasson, Alternate Agent, seeks authority, on behalf of Cabs Unlimited Inc., to publish tariff provisions for "Special Expedited Service."

Applicant proposes to provide a service at any hour of the day or night between 6 Bay Area counties 7 days a week.¹ Applicant alleges that the carrier's equipment will be dispatched within 2 hours of the shipper's request for such service and delivery will be undertaken immediately after the pickup has been accomplished. Applicant avers that the proposed charges for this service are reasonable and compensatory and bases such allegation on its experience in handling similar shipments on interstate traffic. Applicant anticipates that \$43,000 in additional yearly gross revenue will accrue with the establishment of this service.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of February 28, 1975. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

¹The counties involved are Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that applicant's proposal is reasonable and justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. O. R. Thomasson, Alternate Agent, on behalf of Cabs Unlimited Inc., is hereby authorized to publish in Pacific Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Local Freight and Express Tariff No. 8-A, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1 (Series of D. W. Baker, Agent), charges for "Special Expedited Service" as specifically proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority granted herein shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
