SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Douglas Bus Lines, Inc., (Douglas) is a passenger stage corporation operating under certificates of public convenience and necessity granted by this Commission in Decision No. 84274 dated April 1, 1975, in this proceeding. By that decision, Douglas' operating authority will cease on July 1, 1975, unless by further order the Commission provides for authority beyond that date.

The major issue in these proceedings is the mechanical maintenance and safety of Douglas' buses, as well as vehicle cleanliness. In particular Decision No. 84274 required Douglas to make a

showing that it has complied with the following requirements in order to obtain extension of its operating authority:

- (a) Establishing a functioning preventive maintenance program which meets the satisfaction of the Highway Patrol within 60 days after the effective date of that order.
- (b) Establishing a program satisfactory to the Commission for the cleaning of buses within 10 days after the effective date of that order.
- (c) Report to the Commission in writing within 20 days after any vehicle inspection by the Highway Patrol or Commission staff, the improvement in vehicles and company practices following such inspection.
- (d) Report any mechanical failures or any out-of-fuel accurrences which may happen in any of its operations to the Commission staff by telephone within 24 hours of the failure or occurrence, which report shall be confirmed in writing within three working days.

Douglas has advised the Commission that it has established a preventive maintenance program (Paragraph a) and that it has established a program for cleaning the buses (Paragraph b). Douglas has also advised the Commission of several mechanical failures (Paragraph d).

The California Highway Patrol informs us that it will inspect Douglas' buses on June 30, 1975, and will advise us soon thereafter whether Douglas' new preventive maintenance program meets with its approval, and whether and to what extent Douglas' vehicles and company practices are improved.

Accordingly, an additional 45 days should be allowed for receipt and evaluation of the California Highway Patrol report.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Decision No. 84274 is modified to provide that:
 - (a) Certificate Appendices A and B are revoked effective August 15, 1975 instead of July 1, 1975, and
 - (b) Temporary Certificate Appendices C and D are extended to expire August 15, 1975, instead of expiring July 1, 1975.
- 2. In all other respects, Decision No. 84274 shall remain in full force and effect.
