## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. <u>84644</u> issued today in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 709) et al., the Commission found that "liquids, compressed gases and related commodities transported in trucks, trailers or semitrailers with carrier or shipper provided collapsible tanks or bags" should be reinstated in the lists of exempt commodities in Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B, 2, 9-B and 19. The decision also provided that Minimum Rate Tariffs 1-B and 19 should be amended by separate order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix B of Decision No. 65834, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 9, 1975, Fourteenth Revised Page 14 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Minimum Rate Tariff 19 (Appendix A of Decision No. 41363, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein,

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to become effective August 9, 1975, Thirteenth Revised Page 15-A, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than August 9, 1975; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by the common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier that the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later that sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, Decisions Nos. 41363 and 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
