ORDER OF DISMISSAL RE DEFENDANT GENERAL TELEPHONE COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA

Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision No. 84005 incorporates the provisions of a stipulation between defendant General and complainants; that decision was issued as an interim measure in this case.

At the hearing on this matter on June 20, 1975 complainants requested that said ordering paragraph be made final and that the complaint be dismissed as to General on the grounds that the stipulation completely satisfied the complaint. Complainants indicated that dismissal was sought without prejudice to their right to seek enforcement of Commission orders against General, should that ever become necessary.

There was no opposition to the request.

We find that it will not be adverse to the public interest to make said ordering paragraph permanent, and we conclude that the request should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that the above-entitled complaint is dismissed as to defendant General Telephone Company of California.
