INTERIM OPINION AND ORDER

By this petition, California Dump Truck Owners Association seeks modification of the commodity description in List A of Item 30 of Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (MRT 7-A) by including therein "petroleum coke, in bulk." Under the proposal, the distance rock, sand and gravel rates in MRT 7-A would apply to the transportation of such coke_

Petitioner states that intrastate shipments of petroleum coke presently move under the provisions of Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 2 and 15 or rate deviation authority. Petitioner alleges that conditions surrounding the aforementioned transportation have changed since it previously sought authority similar to that herein involved. Petitioner asserts that the uses of petroleum coke as a fuel have recently developed in California because this commodity has a high heating capability and serves as a valuable supplemental source of energy. Petitioner declares that the lack of precise and reasonably stable rates serves to inhibit broader use of this commodity even though its higher thermal units could contribute to fuel conservation.

The certificate of service indicates that copies of the petition were mailed to various interested parties on September 25,

Decision No. 82809 dated April 30, 1974, in Case No. 5437 (Petition for Modification No. 243) denied petitioner's request.

C. 5437 (Pet. 280) - ANV/lmm 1974. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 2, 1974. Two protests were received. In the circumstances, the Commission finds that conditions pertaining to the transportation of petroleum coke, in bulk, have changed considerably since the date Decision No. 82809 was issued in the previous proceeding and there is an urgent need for the establishment of specific rates for the transportation of such commodity. In view of the existing conditions, the Commission concludes that this petition should be granted on an interim basis. A future hearing will be held in this proceeding. IT IS ORDERED that: Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (Appendix B to Decision No. 82061. as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein to become effective September 10, 1975, Second Revised Page 3, Third Revised Page 8 and Third Revised Page 9 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof. 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision No. 82061, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order may be made effective not earlier than September 10, 1975, and may be made effective on not less than one day's notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order. 4_ Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations, such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order, and schedules containing the amendments published -2under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

- 5. In all other respects Decision No. 82061, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
- 6. Case No. 5437, Petition for Modification No. 280 and Application No. 55762 will be consolidated for public hearing and such hearing in these matters shall be held before such Commissioner and/or Examiner as may hereafter be designated by the Commission, at which time all interested parties may appear and be heard.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
