SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

Decision No. 83865 dated December 17, 1974 authorized River Lines Company to sell and transfer its operative rights as a common carrier by vessel to Bay Cities Transportation Company. Ordering Paragraph 9 directed Bay Cities Transportation Company to submit to this Commission proposed in lieu certificates of public convenience and necessity describing and consolidating its common carrier vessel operating authorities as granted by this Commission. The proposed certificates were to reflect the current designations of routes used to describe its authorities authorized by the Commission in the decisions they are intended to replace. To the extent possible, Bay Cities Transportation Company, in submitting the proposed in lieu certificates, was to eliminate any overlapping and duplicate authorities that may now exist.

A proposed in lieu certificate was filed June 27, 1975. The Commission's Transportation Division has reviewed the proposal and advises that it appears to be in compliance with the requirement of Decision No. 83865.

After consideration the Commission finds that the certificate of public convenience and necessity set forth in Appendix A.

correctly describes the common carrier vessel authority of Bay Cities Transportation Company as authorized by Decision No. 83865 and concludes that such authority should be granted.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:


1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Bay Cities Transportation Company, a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a common carrier of property by vessel, as defined in Sections 211(b) and 238 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A of this decision.


2. The common carrier vessel authorities granted by Decisions Nos. 29778, 29969, 30144, 36491, and 83865 are hereby revoked.


3. In all other respects Decision No. 83865 will remain in full force and effect.

Bay Cities Transportation Company, a corporation, by the order contained in the decision noted in the margin, is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a common carrier by vessel for the transportation of property between ports and points on San Francisco, San Pablo, and Suisun Bays, the Sacramento River, and on the San Joaquin River below and including Stockton, California, and their tributaries.
