Application No. 55734 (Filed June 11, 1975)

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The County of Los Angeles (applicant) requests authority to construct a new grade separation structure, to be known as the 190th Street Underpass, under the tracks of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company in the City of Torrance, Los Angeles County.

The priority list of grade separation projects for the fiscal year 1975-76, as set forth in Decision No. 84530, shows this project as Priority No. 97.

The County of Los Angeles is the lead agency for this project pursuant to the Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended, and on March 11, 1975, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles approved an Exemption Declaration.

Notice of application was published in the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 13, 1975. No protests have been received. A public hearing is not necessary.

<u>FINDINGS</u>

After consideration, the Commission finds:

1. Applicant should be authorized to construct 190th Street at separated grades under the tracks of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company in the City of Torrance, Los Angeles County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans attached to the application.

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2. Dimensions, configurations, clearances and walkways should be substantially in accordance with the plans set forth in the application and should comply with applicable rules and general orders of the Commission.

3. Construction and maintenance costs should be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties.

4. The Commission has considered the applicant's Exemption Declaration and finds with reasonable certainty that this project will not have a significant effect on the environment.

<u>CONCLUSIONS</u>

On the basis of the foregoing findings, we conclude that the application should be granted as set forth in the following order:

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The County of Los Angeles is authorized to construct a new grade separation, to be known as the 190th Street Underpass, under the tracks of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company in the. City of Torrance, Los Angeles County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2H-19.1-B.

2. Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order No. 26-D.

3. Walkways along any new or reconstructed trackage, either temporary or permanent, shall conform to General Order No. 118. Walkway areas adjacent to any trackage subject to rail operations shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction. Walkways adjacent to any trackage which may have been temporarily removed from service shall be restored to their original condition prior to resumption of rail operations.

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4. Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and a copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

5. Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, epplicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if the above conditions are not complied with. This authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
