## OPINION AND ORDER

Atlantic Transfer Co., a California corporation, possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space at Los Angeles. By this application, it seeks authority to sell, and City Distribution Services, a California corporation, to purchase the aforementioned operative right.

City Distributors Services operates as a public utility warehouseman at Anaheim, Carson, Long Beach and Santa Fe Springs, pursuant to a certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 83817 dated December 10, 1974, in Appplication No. 55277. According to the application, applicant purchaser has the financial resources, experience and personnel to conduct the warehouse service involved. The cash consideration is \$5,000.00.

The certificate of service indicates that a copy of the application was mailed to California Trucking Association at Los Angeles and Burlingame on September 5, 1975. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of September 11, 1975. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

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not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the transfer. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61—Series. Failure to comply with the provisions of General Order No. 61—Series may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- 4. On or before the end of the third month after the transfer the purchaser shall cause to be filed with the Commission, in such form as the Commission may prescribe, an annual report, or reports, related to the operations of the seller for the period commencing with the first day of the current year to and including the effective date of the transfer.
- 5. In the event the transfer authorized in paragraph 1 is completed, effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3, a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to City Distribution Services, a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 6. The operative rights stated in Decisions Nos. 64814 and 83817 are revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3.
- 7. Transferee shall maintain its accounting records in conformance with any applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and each year shall file with the Commission an annual report of its operations in such form, content and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of the order to be made upon Atlantic Transfer Co. and City Distribution Services, or to mail a certified copy thereof to them at their last know addresses as shown in the Commission's records and to mail a copy of this order to Jack L. Dawson, Agent, and Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
