ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision No. 82011 dated October 16, 1973, in Application No. 54241, James R. Nyhan and Marjorie R. Nyhan, doing business as Bomar's Charter Service, were granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation between various hotels on the San Francisco Peninsula and Union Square in San Francisco.

Since October 16, 1974, Bomar's Charter Service has had no evidence applicable to a passenger stage corporation on file with this Commission showing adequate protection against liability imposed by law for payment of damage for personal injury or property damage, as required by General Order No. 101-C.

Written notices were sent by the Commission to the carrier on August 21, 1974 and February 11, 1975 warning that they should comply with General Order 101-C by filing a Certificate of Insurance.

Upon receiving no response to the Commission's notices from the carrier, letters were then sent on March 11, 1975 to the various hotels concerning the status of its service to their facilities. The Commission was notified by five hotels that the carrier had terminated its operations sometime in mid-year of 1974.

It appears and the Commission finds that these matters constitute good cause for the revocation of the forenamed certificate and that such revocation would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission, therefore, concludes that the certificate should be revoked and that tariffs and timetables applicable to the service thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a passenger stage corporation between the various hotels in the San Francisco Peninsula, on the one hand, and Union Square, San Francisco, on the other hand, authorized by Decision' No. 82011 in Application No. 54241 is hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission in the name of Mr. James R. Nyhan and Mrs. Marjorie R. Nyhan, doing business as Bomar's Charter Service, are canceled upon the effective date of this order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof, unless before such effective date there shall have been filed with the Commission written response to this order requesting public hearing in which event the effective date of this order shall be stayed until further order of the Commission.
