## SECOND ORDER OF MODIFICATION

By Decision No. 85253 dated December 16, 1975, the certificated authority of Thompson Bros., Inc. was transferred to The Santa Fe Trail Transportation Company. By Decision No. 85369 dated January 20,1976 , Decision No. 85253 was modified by restating the operating authority of The Santa Fe Trail Transportation Company in the form of an in lieu certificate. Because of certain irregularities in restating the new certificate, Decision No. 85253 will again be amended by substituting a new Appendix A.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Decision No. 85253, as amended by Decision No. 85369 , is hereby further amended by replacing its Appendix A with Appendix A attached hereto.

z. Altomobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger autowobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freicht automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
2. Iivestock, viz.: banrows, boars, bulls, butcher hogs, calves, cattie, cows, dajry cattle, ewes, feeder piss, gilts, goats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pies, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.
3. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in inquids in buik, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers on a combination of such hishway venicies.
4. Comnodities when transported in bulk in dump-type trucks or trailers or in hopper-type trucks or trailers.
5. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
