## ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The complaint alleges that defendent failed to make directory advertising deletions requested by complainant. Complainant seeks reparations for the alleged unauthorized advertising for which it paid. On January 5, 1976, defendant submitted a letter of defects (Rule 12) contending that the complaint did not state the facts upon which the complaint was based (Rule 10). On January 7, 1976, the Executive Director advised complainant that:

> "Your complaint is presently insufficient in that it does not identify the errors in the directory, the changes requested, whether an employee of defendent agreed to the changes, or the directories concerned. These facts should be alleged."

Complainant was further advised that it had until Sanuary 26, 1976 to respond to the letter of the Executive Director. No response was received by that date.



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The complaint contains conclusory allegations with no facts alleged in support thereof. The Commission finds that the complaint, as filed, does not allege specific facts to properly state a cause of action on which the Commission could make a decision. Complainant has declined the opportunity to amend. The complaint must be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 10026 is dismissed. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
