OPINION AND ORDER

David & Sons, Inc. is a manufacturer engaged in the business of processing and distributing confectionery sunflower seeds and kernels to both wholesale and retail customers on a mational basis. By this petition, it seeks to have Minimum Rate Tariff 2 amended by establishing therein an exception rating of Class 55 for the transportation of less-truckload shipments of sunflower seeds and kernels. Currently a higher less-truckload rating of Class 65 applies to such transportation.

Petitioner states that sunflower seeds and kernels are similar in nature and shipping characteristics to roasted and salted corn kernels and roasted peanuts and the lower less-truck-load rawing sought herein applies to the transportation of the latter two commodities. Petitioner alleges that its confectionary sunflower seeds and kernels are in direct competition with said corn kernels and peanuts throughout the industry including the vending machine trade. Petitioner avers that it annually distributes 3,500 to 4,000 tons of sunflower seeds and kernels in California and the difference in the classification ratings between

Petitioner's proposal is set forth in detail in Exhibit A attached to the petition.

C. 5432 (Pet. 875) - ANV* its products and corn kernels and peanuts causes it to operate at a substantial trade disadvantage. Petitioner declares that its proposal has been discussed with carriers currently involved in the transportation of sunflower seeds and kernels and developed through cooperation with said carriers. Copy of the petition was mailed to California Trucking Association on or about December 18, 1975. The petition was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of December 22, 1975. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received. In the circumstances, the Commission finds that petitioner's proposal is reasonable and the resulting rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation involved. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the petition should be granted. IT IS ORDERED that: 1. Minimum Rate Tariff 2 (Appendix D to Decision 31606, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective April 1, 1976, Forty-eighth Revised Page 6, Fifty-third Revised Page 9 and Thirteenth Revised Page 37-C, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof. 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject to Decision 31606, as amended, are hereby authorized to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein. 3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days -2C. 5432 (Pet. 875) - ANV*

after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects Decision 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
