## OPINION

Donald N. Jones, Executor of the Will of Orville K. Smith, Deceased, requests authority to transfer all outstanding stock of Smith Tank Lines, a California corporation, and Floyd F. Dirlam, an individual, requests authority to acquire control of said corporation.

Orville K. Smith died in Fresno, California, on March 5, 1974. The decedent's Will was admitted to probate in the Superior Court of the State of California in and for the County of Fresno, in the Matter of the Estate of Orville K. Smith, Deceased, Fresno County Probate 50829. Donald H. Jones was appointed Executor of decedent's Will on March 27, 1974. Certified copies of the Will of Orville K. Smith and of Letters Testamentary issued to Donald M. Jones are attached to the application as Exhibits "A" and "B".

As of the date of his death, Orville K. Smith owned 384 shares of capital stock, par value \$100.00, of Smith Tank Lines, representing all of the issued and outstanding stock of the corporation. The corporation holds a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity granted by Decision 44246, dated May 26, 1950, in Application 31142 and transferred to it by Decision 54721, dated March 26, 1957, in Application 58877. The certificate authorizes transportation, as a petroleum irregular route carrier, of petroleum and petroleum products, in bulk and in tank trucks and trailers between all points and places in the State.

2. Within ninety days after the date hereof, Floyd F. Dirlam and Smith Tank Lines shall file reports informing the Commission whether or not the stock acquisition has been completed.
