# $\underline{O P I N I O N}$

This is an application by Arthur S. and Gladys Amerian for authority to control Monsons Inc. DBA Greenfield Village Water Company. Monsons Inc. was certificated under authority granted in Decision No. 50255 in Application No. 33769.

Monsons Inc. DBA Greenfield Village Water Company serves 43 service connections in an area known as Greenfield Village southcast of the city of Fresno. Applicant Arthur S. Amerian has operated the system under the prior ownership.

Applicants represent as follows:

1. There are no customer deposits presently being held by the utility.

2. There are no outstanding advances for construction held by the utility.

3. No operational effects would result from the proposed transfer of control.

4. That the consideration for the transfer is the payment of \$18,000 cash and \$2,000 in escrow until repairs to a pump are paid for and the balance of the \$2,000 to the seller.

5. Monsons Inc. reported outstanding stock \$10,200 as of December 31, 1975.
