OPINICN

Myles Williams and Russell Vreeland, doing business as Carmel Motoring Company, hereinafter referred to as sellers, request authority to transfer to Patrick D. Linington, hereinafter referred to as purchaser, their Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a Passenger Stage Corporation for sightseeing purposes in the Carmel area.

The sellers and purchaser have entered into a written agreement that sets forth the terms and conditions of the transfer of the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity. The parties have agreed that the purchase price will be the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of February 2, 1976. The Commission's Transportation Division staff has reviewd the application and recommends that, in the absence of protest or request for public hearing, it be granted by ex parte order. No protest or request for hearing has been received.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that it should be authorized. We further find with reasonable certainty that the project involved in this proceeding will not have a significant effect on the environment.

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A public hearing is not necessary and the application should be granted.

The order which follows will provide for, in the event the transfer is completed, the revocation of the Certificate presently held by Myles Williams and Russell Vreeland, doing business as Carmel Motoring Company, and the issuance of a Certificate in Appendix form to Patrick D. Limington.

Purchaser is placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, such rights extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. On or before July 1, 1975 Myles Williams and Russell Vreeland, doing business as Carmel Motoring Company, may sell and transfer the operative rights referred to in the application to the purchaser Patrick D. Linington.

2. Within thirty days after the transfer the purchaser shall file with the Commission written acceptance of the Certificate and a true copy of the bill of sale or other instrument of transfer.

3. Purchaser shall amend or reissue the tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission, naming rates and rules governing the common carrier operations transferred to show that he has adopted or establiched, as his own, the rates and rules. The tariff and timetable filings shall be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of

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the tariff and timetable filings shall be concurrent with the transfer. The tariff and timetable filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filings of tariffs and timetables set forth in the Commission's General Orders 79-Series and 98-Series. Failure to comply with the provisions of General Orders 79-Series and 98-Series may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

4. In the event the transfer authorized in Paragraph 1 is completed, effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by Paragraph 3, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is granted to Patrick D. Linington authorizing him to operate as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 226 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

5. The Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity granted by Decision 34771 is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by Paragraph 3.

6. Purchaser shall comply with the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol, the rules and regulations of the Commission's General Order 98-Series, and insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order 101-Series.

7. Furchaser shall maintain his accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of his operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

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The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

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SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORIZATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, LIMITATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

The Certificate hereinafter noted supersedes all operative authority heretofore granted to Lyles Williams and Russell Vreeland, doing business as Carmel Motoring Company.

Patrick D. Linington, by the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized as a passenger stage corporation to transport passengers for sightseeing purposes, commencing and terminating within the City of Carmel, to various points of interest within the City of Carmel and its immediate vicinity, 17-Mile Drive and Point Lobos over and along the routes hereinafter described, subject, however, to the authority of this Commission to change or modify said routes at any time and subject to the following provisions:

- (a) When route descriptions are given in one direction, they apply to operation in either direction unless otherwise indicated.
- (b) All service herein authorized shall be limited to the transportation of round-trip passengers only.
- (c) Passengers shall be picked up and discharged only at the Harrison Memorial Library and the La Playa Hotel within the City of Carmel.

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SECTION 2. ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS.

Route No. 1 - Carmel Tour

Commencing at the Harrison Memorial Library, located at Lincoln Street and Gth Avenue In Carmel, thence over the most appropriate route to the La Playa Hotel, located at Camino Real and 8th Avenue In Carmel, thence over the most appropriate and scenic route within the City of Carmel and Its Immediate vicinity to the Carmel Hission, thence return by the most appropriate and scenic route within the City of Carmel and Its Immediate vicinity to the Harrison Memorial Library and the La Playa Hotel.

Route No. 2 - Carmel/17-Mile Drive Tour

Commencing with and including the Carmel Tour as described in Route No. 1, thence over the most appropriate and scenic route within the City of Carmel to the Carmel Gate, thence over the most appropriate and scenic route within the 17-Mile prive area, thence return through the Carmel Gate over the most appropriate and scenic route within the City of Carmel to the Harrison Memorial Library and the La Playa Hotel.

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SECTION 2. ROUTE DESCRIPTIONS. (Continued)

Route No. 3 - Carmel/Point Lobos Tour

Commencing with and including the Carmel Tour as described in Route No. 1, thence over the most appropriate and scenic route within the City of Carmel and its immediate vicinity to Rio Road, thence via Rio Road and Highway 1 to Point Lobos State Reserve, thence return via Highway 1 and Rio Road to the City of Carmel, thence via the most appropriate and scenic route within Carmel and its immediate vicinity to the Harrison Memorial Library and the La Playa Hotel.

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
