OPINION AND ORDER

Olympic Delivery Service, Inc., a corporation, doing business as Rocket Messenger Service, operates as a freight forwarder by air between points in the San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego areas. By this application, it seeks authority to increase its charges from: (1) 20 to 50 cents for each \$100 valuation that the declared value of a shipment exceeds 50 cents per pound or \$250 whichever is higher; (2) \$10 to \$15 for special pickup or delivery service; (3) \$30 to \$40 for special and same day or overnight services; and (4) 50 to 70 cents per mile for the mileage traversed beyond the closest pickup zone on shipments located outside said zone.

Applicant states that the costs of providing the aforementioned specialized services have increased substantially and the proposed increases are intended to offset the increased costs incurred by it in providing such services. Applicant anticipates that a yearly revenue increase of \$12,189 would result under its proposal.

The rates and services are set forth in detail in Items 50, 180, 190, 310 and 320 of applicant's Local Forwarder Tariff 1, Cal.P.U.C. 1.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that increases resulting from publication of the charges as proposed in the application are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- Olympic Delivery Service, Inc., a corporation, is hereby authorized to publish charges in its Local Forwarder Tariff 1, Cal. P.U.C. 1, as specifically proposed in the application.
- Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.
- The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
