ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By Decision No. 82848 dated May 7, 1974 Signal Trucking Service, Ltd. (Signal) was granted interim authority to depart from the provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff 2 for certain transportation performed for Procter & Gamble Company. In July 1975 Signal ceased operations and its permits were placed in voluntary suspension.

Since Signal has not operated and its permits have been in suspension since July 1975 it appears and the Commission finds and concludes that the authority granted to Signal by Decision No. 82848 should be revoked and Application No. 54749 should be dismissed.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The authority granted to Signal Trucking Service, Ltd. by Decision No. 82848 is revoked.
2. Application No. 54749 is dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
