ORDER OF REVOCATION

By Decision 82802, dated April 30, 1974, in Application 54681, Gerald Lynn Corbett was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (PSC-941) to operate as a Passenger Stage Corporation between Solvang Castle and Solvang.

Since April 30, 1974, the effective date of Decision 82802, Gerald Lynn Corbett has had no evidence on file with this Commission showing adequate protection against liability imposed by law for payment of damage for personal injury or property damage, as required by General Order 101-C.

The applicant informed this Commission by letter dated October 30, 1974 that passenger service never did commence between the authorized points, Solvang Castle and Santa Ynez Mission and intermediate points in Solvang.


It appears and the Commission finds that these matters constitute good cause for the revocation of the aforementioned certificate and that such revocation would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission, therefore, concludes that the certificate should be revoked.

IT IS ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a Passenger Stage Corporation between Solvang Castle and Solvang authorized by Decision 82802, in Application 54681, in the name of Gerald Lynn Corbett is hereby revoked upon the effective date of this order.

The Executive Director of the Commission shall mail a certified copy of this order to Gerald Lynn Corbett at 2540 Janin Way, Solvang, CA 93463, last known address as shown on the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentieth day after the date hereof.
