Decision 85366, dated January 20, 1976, in this proceeding, authorized Wam Bros., Inc., a Califomia corporation, to acquire a certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by this Commission to Golden West Freight Lines, a Califomia comporation. That decision also provided that the Commission would, by subsequent order, issue an in ileu certificate, in appendix form, to Wam Bros., Inc., reflecting the consolidation of its prior and newly-acquired certificates.

The restatement of the operating authorities herein neither broadens nor lessens the scope of the separate operating authorities heretofore granted. The effective date of this order should be the date on which it is signed since there is no reason to delay the disposition of this matter.

## EINALORDER <br> IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of pubilc convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Wam Bros., Inc., a Califomia corporation,
authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier, as defined In Scction 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points within the area and over the routes as specifically set forth in Appendix A of this decision.
2. In providing service pursuant to the authority granted by this order, Wam Bros., Inc., shall comply with the following service regulations. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of the authority:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall ilie a written acceptance of the certisicate granted. Warn Bros., Inc., is placed on notice that if it accepts the certificate it will be required, among other things, to comply with the safety rules administered by the Califomia Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Comrissions's General Order 100-Series.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date of this order, Warn Bros., Inc., shail estabilsh the authorized service and cancel, amend or refile tarifis, in tripilcate, in the Commission's office, pursuant to the certificatc granted by this decision.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days" notice to the commission and the pubilc, and the effective date of the tarifi filings shall be concurrent with the estabilshment of the authorized service.
(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shail comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tarifis set forth In the Commission's General Order 80-Series.
(e) Wam Bros., Inc., shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shail file with the

Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.
(土) Warm Bros., Inc., shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If it elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General order.
3. The certificate of pubic convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall be in ilea of and supersede the highway common carrier certificates of public convenience and necessity heretofore granted to or acquired by Wame Bros., Inc., which certificates, including amendment, are identified below and are hereby revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph $2(b)$ :

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Wam Bros., Inc., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the following transportation:
I. GENERAL COMMODITIES, with exceptions hereinafter noted, between all points and places located within the defined geographical area; within the described territories; or within 25 miles lateraily of certain designated highways as follows:
A. Between all points within the area bounded by a inne commencing at the junction of the Paciric ocean and the northem boundary of Marin County; northeasteriy and southeasterly alons said boundary to its junction with the northern boundary of Contra Costa County; along said boundary to its intersection with Interstate Highway 80 (at the Carquinez Bridge); northeasteriy along Interstate H1ghway 80 to its intersection with Interstate Highway 880 (approximately 9 miles east of Davis); northeasterly and easteriy along Interstate Fighway 880 to the point where it reintersects Interstate Hughway 80 (near McClelian Air Force Base); northeasterly alons Interstate Highway 80 (and Antelope Road) to Citrus Heights; thence, in the reverse direction, southwesteriy along Antelope Road and Interstate Highway 80 to its junction with State Highway 99 (at Sacramento): southeasterly along State Highway 99 to the point where it intersects the northern boundary of San Joaquin County (near Galt); easterly and southerly along the eastem boundary of San Joaquin County to its function with the eastem boundary of Stanislaus County (near the Calaveras River); southeasterly and southwesteriy along the boundary of Stanislaus County to the point where its southern boundary intersects State Highway 99 (near Iurlock); thence southeasterly along State Highway 99 to the point where it intersects the northwestern boundary

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of Tulare County (near Kingsburg); thence along the northern, eastern and southern boundary of Tulare County to the point where its southern boundary intersects State Highway 99 (near Delano); southeriy and southeasteriy along State Higinway 99 to its junction with Interstate Highway 5 (near Wheeler Ridge); southeasteriy along Interstate Fighway 5 to the point where it intersects the northem boundary of Los Angeies Basin Territory, as described in Note A (near San Fernando); thence generally easterly, southerly and westeriy along the boundary of Los Angeles Basin Territory to the point where it again intersects Interstate H1ghway 5 (mear San Onorre); thence southcasterly and southeriy along Interstate Highway 5 through and inciuding the San Diego Territory, as described in Note $B$, to the intersection of sald highway with the Calinomia-Mexico border; westerly along said border to the Pacific Ocean; thence northerly and northwesterly along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean to the point of beginning; and
B. Between all points on or within 25 miles laterally of only those portions of the foliowing designated hiehways which form an integral part of the boundary of the geographical area described above:

Interstate H1ghway 80
Interstate Highway 880
State H1ghway 99
Interstate Highway 5
including the more distant off-route points of lake Isabella and Kemville; and including points located within 25 miles lateraily of:

1. That portion of State Highway 99 which traverses San Joaquin and Stanisiaus Counties; and
2. That portion of Interstate Highway 5 which traverses Los Angeles Basin and San Diego Territories.

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II. GENERAL COMMODITIES, with exceptions hereinafter noted, northbound from ail points and places within orange County to all points located on or within 15 miles laterally of U. S. Highway 101 lyine between the northem boundary of Marin County and the City of Santa Rosa, both inclusive.
III. Mechanscal duplications and overlaps which occur in describing the operating authority granted herein shail not be construed as conferring more than one operating right to transport the same commodities between the same

Except that where specifically noted and pursuant to the authority herein granted, carrier shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods, personal effects and office, store and institution furmiture, fixtures and equipment not packee in salesmen's hand sample cases, suitcases, overnight or boston bags, brief cases, hat boxes, valises, traveling bass, trunks, lift vans, barreis, boxes, cartons, crates, cases, baskets, pails, kits, tubs, drums, bags (jute, cotton, burlap or gunny) or bundies (completely wrapped in jute, cotton, burlap, gunny, fibreboard, or straw matting).
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis, freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: barrows, boars, bulis, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dalry cattle, ewes, feeder pigs, gilts, goats, heifers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pıgs, rams (bucks), sheep, sheep canp outifits, sows, steers, stags, swine or wethers.

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4．Commodities when transported in bulk in dump－type trucks or trailers or in hopper－type trucks or trallers．

5．Logs．
6．Articles of extraordinary value．
7．Batteries in speciaily desipned steel racks between Anaheim and Fremont and retum of the empty racks， except shipments of batteries or returning empty batteries or battery raciks which have a prior or subsequent for－hire rali，motor or water carrier movement．

In performing the service herein authorized，carrier may make use of any and all streets，roads，highways and bridges necessary or convenient for the performance of said service．

## NOTE A

## LOS ANGELES BASIN TERRITORY

Los Angeles Basin Territory incluces that area embraced by the following boundary：Beginning at the point the Ventura County－ Los Angeles County Boundary Iine intersects the Pacific Ocean； thence northeasterly aiong said county line to the point it inter－ sects State Highway 118，approximately two miles west of Chatsworth； easterly along State Highway 118 to Sepulveda Boulevard；northerly along Sepulveda Boulevarc to Chatsworth Drive；northeasterly along Chatsworth Drive to the corporate boundary of the City of San Fer－ nando；westerly and northerly along sald corporate boundary of the City of San Fernando to Maclay Avenue；northeasteriy along Maclay Avenue and its prolongation to the Anceies National Forest Boundary； southeasteriy and easterly along the Angeles National Forest and San Bemardino National Forest Boundary to Mili Creck Road（State Highway 38）；westerly along M11 Creek Road to Bryant Street； southerly along Bryant Street to and including the unincorporated community of Yucaipa；westerly aiong Yucaipa Boulevard to Inter－ state H1ghway 10；northwesterly along Interstate H⿰亻⿻乚㇒ Rediands Boulevard；northwesteriy along Redlands Boulevard to Barton Road；westerly along Barton Road to Ia Cadena Drive； southeriy along La Cadena Drive to Iora Avenue；southeriy aiong

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Iowa Avenue to State Hishway 60; Southeasterly along State Hi ghway 60 and U.S. Heghway 395 to Nuevo Road; easterly along Nuevo Road via Nuevo and Lakeview to State Highway 79; southerly along State Highway 79 to State Highway 74; thence westerly to the corporate boundary of the City of Hemet; southerly, westeriy and northerly along said corporate boundary to The Atchison, Topeka \& Santa Fe right-of-way; southeriy along said right-of-way to Washington Road; southerdy along Washingt on Road through and including the unincorporated community of Winchester to Benton Road; westerly aiong Benton Road to Winchester Road (State Highway 79) to Jefferson Avenue; southerly along Jefferson Avenue to J.S. Highway 395; southerly along J.S. Highway 395 to the Riverside County-San Diego County Boundary Iine; westerly along said boundary ilne to the Orange County-San Diego County Boundary IIne; southerly along said boundary line to the Pacific Ocean; northwesterly along the shoreine of the Pacific Ocean to point of beginning, Inciuding the point of March Air Force Base.

## NOTE B

## SAN DIEGO TERRITORY

The San Diego Territory includes that area embraced by following an imaginary line starting at a point approximately four miles north of La Jolia on the Pacific coast shoreine running east to Miramar on J.S. Highway 395; thence following an imaginary Iine munning southeasteriy to Lakeside on State Highway 67 ; thence southeriy on County Road S 17 (San Diego County) and its prolongation to State EIghway 94; easterly on State Eighway 94 to Jamul; thence due south following an imaginary ine to the CallfomiaMexico Boundary Ine; thence westeriy along the boundary inne to the Pacific Ocean and north along the shoreline to point of beginning.
