OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc. on behalf of Haslett Company (Haslett), seeks to cancel from one of its tariffs Haslett's participation in the 80,000-pound and 100,000 pound rail competitive rates on green coffee from San Francisco to San Leandro.<sup>1</sup>

Applicant states that Haslett has reviewed its records and has determined that it has not transported any green coffee in intrastate traffic from and to the points involved.

Applicant avers that its proposal would have no dollar impact on Haslett's California intrastate gross revenue.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of November 26, 1975. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that increases resulting from cancellation of the rates as proposed are justified.

A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:





1. Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., is hereby authorized, on behalf of Haslett Company, to cancel the carrier's participation in the rates in Item No. 1315 of its Local, Joint and Proportional Freight and Express Tariff No. 109, Cal. P.U.C. No. 13, as specifically proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
