OPINION AND ORDER

Shulman Air Freight, Inc., a corporation, operates as a freight forwarder between various points in California. By this application, it seeks to increase the rates and charges in its tariffs by an average of 40 percent.²

Applicant states that it has not increased its rates since they were originally established on November 9, 1973, and it has incurred, since that date, increases of 66 percent on shipments under 100 pounds and increases ranging from 18 to 43 percent on shipments of 100 pounds or more for transportation it has purchased from the major air carriers. Applicant alleges that it has also experienced labor-related increases in costs of approximately 21 percent since November 9, 1973. Applicant declares that the sought increases would provide it with the minimum amount of revenue needed

The present and proposed rates in cents per shipment for a representative movement of general commodities are:

These rates are set forth in detail in California Intra-State Airfreight Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 1, and California Intra-State SkyCab Service Tariff No. 1, Cal.P.U.C. No. 2.

to recover the aforementioned increases in costs and a yearly revenue increase approximating \$97,000 would result under its proposal.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of March 9, 1976. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that increases which will result from applicant's proposal are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Shulman Air Freight, Inc., a corporation, is authorized to publish increased rates and charges as specifically proposed in the application.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days notice to the Commission and to the public.
- 3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
