BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Investigation for the purpose of considering and determining exception ratings which apply in lieu of those named in the governing classification as provided in Exception Ratings Tariff 1 and the revisions or reissues thereof.

SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

On August 27, 1975, the Commission's Freight Economics Branch of its Transportation Division mailed to interested parties a staff report which recommended the cancellation of certain exception ratings presently published in Exception Ratings Tariff 1 (ERT-1).

According to the report, some exception ratings, identified as item numbers from the National Motor Freight Classification (NMFC) and located in Sections 2-B and 2-C of ERT-1, move a significant volume of traffic. The staff proposes that such exception ratings be retained on a temporary basis until it completes its study of the involved ratings. Other exception ratings in Sections 2-B and 2-C of ERT-1 apply to commodities which move little or no traffic or move in less-truckload lots or in mixed shipments with other commodities. The volume of such movements under the latter exception ratings does not justify the continuance of said rates. The staff recommends that these ratings be canceled. The report also suggests that the exception ratings for fir barks (NMFC 21560) and sawdust (ll3200) be canceled as they are duplicated in Item 370 of Minimum Rate Tariff 2.

Written comments were received from Avon Products, Inc., California Manufacturers Association, California Trucking Association, Certain-Teed Products Corporation, Chevron Chemical Company, County of

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Los Angeles (Purchasing and Stores Department), Diamond Shamrock Chemical, Dow Chemical U.S.A., Flintkote, General Portland Inc. (California Division), Johns-Manville Corporation, Kaiser Aluminum & Chemical Corporation, Potlach Corporation, PPG Industries, Inc., Purex Corporation, State of California (Department of General Services), United States Borax & Chemical Corporation, United States Gypsum Company, United States Steel Corporation, and Wigle and Larimore. Certain suggested amendments by some of the aforementioned parties will be adopted.

The staff report and replies thereto are respectively received in evidence as Ex Parte Exhibits 1 and 2 in Case 7858.

Upon consideration of the evidence in this proceeding, the Commission finds that the staff's proposal, as hereinafter modified by certain suggestions from some of the interested parties, is reasonable and justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Exception Ratings Tariff 1 should be amended accordingly by the order herein.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff 1 (Appendix A of Decision 66195, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective August 1, 1976, the revised pages contained in Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

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2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision 66195, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the increases necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.

3. Tariff publications required or authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to

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the public; such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later that August 1, 1976; and as to tariff publications which are authorized but not required, the authority shall expire unless exercised within sixty days after the effective date of this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 461.5 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects Decision 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
