O P I N I O N

Applicant is a public utility warehouseman for the storage of commodities requiring refrigeration at Oakland and Sacramento.

The rates charged by applicant for storage, handling, and other services incidental thereto, and the rules and regulations governing the application of rates at Sacramento are contained in California Warehouse Tariff Bureau Precooling Warehouse Tariff No. 21, Cal. P.U.C. No. 230, of Jack L. Dawson, Agent; California Warehouse Tariff Bureau Cold Storage Warehouse Tariff No. 19, Cal. P.U.C. No. 228, of Jack L. Dawson, Agent; and United States Cold Storage of California Cold Storage Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1.

Applicant requests authority to increase rates and charges by 12 percent, which will be accomplished by adding a surcharge to the rates and charges set forth in the above-listed tariffs except United States Cold Storage of California, Cold Storage Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1 which applicant proposes to cancel. The requested rate increase has been determined by applicant without consultation or agreement with any other warehousemen. If the authority is granted the 12 percent surcharge provision will be published in an individual tariff.

Applicant alleges that present rates are no longer compensatory due to increased costs of labor, power, taxes, and other operating costs and the increased rates are necessary to enable applicant to provide efficient service to the public.

Notice of the proposed increase was sent to each of applicant's storers. None of the storers has registered any objection to the proposed increase.

Findings

1. The proposed increase has been shown to be justified.
2. A public hearing is not necessary.

The Commission concludes that the application should be granted. Since there are no protests and since the cold storage warehouse industry will be deregulated effective January 1, 1977 (S.B. 1319, Ch. 58, Stat. 1976) the Commission further concludes that the effective date of this order should be the date on which it is signed.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Applicant is authorized to establish the increased rates in Application No. 56439. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

2. The authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

3. The authority granted by this order is subject to the express condition that applicant will never urge before this Commission in any proceeding under Section 734 of the Public Utilities Code, or in any other proceeding, that this opinion and order constitute a finding of fact of the reasonableness of any particular rate or charge. The filing of rates and charges pursuant to this order will be construed as a consent to this condition.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
