ORDER EXTENDING TIME

In Decision No. 85808 dated May 11, 1976 in Case No. 10033, the Commission ordered, among other things, that Warn Bros., Inc. shall collect undercharges in the amount of \$13,928.61 from respondent Norman Williams Co. and pay that amount as a fine to the Commission. By letter received July 8, 1976 Warn Bros. informs us that Norman Williams Co. has refused to pay the undercharges and that Warn Bros. is preparing legal action to collect the undercharges. Warn Bros. requests an extension of time of 180 days in which to pay the \$13,928.61 fine. Warn Bros. has paid the \$3,000 punitive fine ordered by Decision No. 85808. The Transportation Division has no objection to the extension of time. Warn Bros.'s request is reasonable and should be granted.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that the time in which Warn Bros., Inc. shall pay the fine ordered by Ordering Paragraph 2 of Decision No. 85808 is extended to February 1, 1977. In all other respects Decision No. 85808 shall remain in full force and effect.
