SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 86061 established General Order No. 139, effective September 1, 1976. Finding 9 of that decision provides:

"Each of the minimum rate tariffs, except MRTs 3-A and 4-B, should be amended to show that loss or damage claims must be filed and processed according to the provisions of General Order No. 139. For convenience, such tariff amendments should be made by separate orders."

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 6-B (Appendix A to Decision No. 82350, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective September 1, 1976, Second Revised Page 2 and Fourth Revised Page 14 attached bereto.
