## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision 85802 dated May 11, 1976, we issued an in lieu certificate of public convenience and necessity to Warn Bros., Inc. which consolidated all of its existing and newly acquired rights to operate as a highway common carrier.

By Petition for Modification filed August 30, 1976, Warn Bros., Inc. requests an extension of time of 90 days to file the necessary tariffs. Petitioner further requests authority under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code to increase certain rates based upon alternate application of rail rates to the level of rates prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff 2. The carrier contends that while it generally has not been tendered shipments subject to rail rates, applicant has determined that these rates will not be compensatory.

After consideration, we find that the increase in rates sought herein is justified and conclude that the extension of time and the authority sought under Section 454 of the Public Utilities Code should be granted. We further conclude that the effective date of this order should be the date on which it is signed because there is no reason to delay granting the relief requested. A public hearing is not necessary.

## ORDER

## IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Warn Bros., Inc. is granted an extension of time to file the tariffs required by ordering paragraph 2 (b) of Decision 85802 to and including December 31, 1976.
- 2. Warn Bros., Inc. may increase the rail rates to the level of the minimum rates as proposed in the petition for modification.

In all other respects, Decision 85802 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order is the date hereof.
