In the Matter of the Application of HARBOR CARRIERS, INC., a corporation, for authorization to suspend operation of vessels "on schedule" as a common carrier of passengers between San Francisco and Sausalito.

ORDER FURTHER EXTENDING TIME

Ordering Paragraph 3 of Decision No. 79143 dated September 8, 1971 in this proceeding granted applicant a one-year period to commence operations under the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 73811 dated March 5, 1968 in Application No. 49712, which authorized scheduled common carrier passenger service by vessel between San Francisco and Sausalito subject to the condition that if service was not commenced within the one-year period the authority should lapse and terminate unless the one-year period was extended by further order of the Commission. The authority has been extended each year, with the present expiration on September 28, 1976 (Decision No. 84933 dated September 23, 1975).

Applicant filed a petition on August 2, 1976 to request additional time within which to institute service. Applicant's continuing efforts to obtain a suitable landing place in Sausalito have been described in prior pleadings. This petition alleges that applicant is negotiating with the Golden Gate Bridge District for authority to use its dock in Sausalito and that results will not be obtained before the end of September.

No protests have been filed. The petition should be granted.
