OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant is a public utility warehouseman for the storage of general commodities at South San Francisco. The rates, rules and regulations governing applicant's operations are contained in California Warehouse Tariff Bureau Tariffs Nos. 48-A and 83-C, Cal.P.U.C. Nos. 253 and 273, respectively, of Jack L. Dawson, Agent.

Applicant requests authority to publish on five days' notice to the Commission and to the public an increase in its rates and charges for storage of 10 percent and an increase in its rates and charges for other than storage of 20 percent. The overall effect of this increase is 14.7 percent in applicant's warehouse revenue. The requested rate increase has been determined by applicant without consultation or agreement with any other warehouseman.

Applicant alleges that its present rates do not yield sufficient revenue to allow it to conduct its warehouse operations at a profit.

Applicant's rates were last adjusted pursuant to authority granted by Decision 83246 dated August 6, 1974, in Application 54589.

Applicant further alleges that additional revenue is required because of increased costs in all phases of operation, the most significant being the increased cost of labor, power and taxes.

Exhibit C, attached to the application, contains revenue and expense data for the test year ended April 30, 1976, together

with adjustments to reflect the proposed increase in revenue should the application be granted. The exhibit discloses that during the test year applicant realized a loss of \$6,620 and an operating ratio of 106.5 percent. Had the sought rates been in effect during the test year, applicant would have realized, after taxes, a profit of \$2,981 and an operating ratio of 97.5 percent.

Notice of the proposed increase was sent to each of applicant's storers. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of July 22, 1976. None of the storers have registered any objection to the proposed increase.

Findings:

1. Applicant's rates were last adjusted by Decision 83246 dated August 6, 1974, in Application 54589.
2. Since applicant's rates were last adjusted, it has experienced increases in operating expenses, the most significant being the cost of labor, power and taxes.
3. Under the increase sought herein, applicant estimates it will realize additional revenue of \$15,084 and an operating ratio after taxes of 97.5 percent.
4. The proposed increases in applicant's rates and charges have been shown to be justified.
5. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Pacific Coast Service Co. is authorized to establish the increased rates and charges proposed in Application 56628. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than five days after the effective date of this order on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

2. The authority shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.


3. The authority granted by this order is subject to the express condition that applicant will never urge before this Commission in any proceeding under Section 734 of the Public Utilities Code, or in any other proceeding, that this opinion and order constitute a finding of fact of the reasonableness of any particular rate or charge. The filing of rates and charges pursuant to this order will be construed as a consent to this condition.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.




