Application of San Diego Van & Storage Company for authority to extend the expiration date of Decision 82-12-079 dated December 15, 1982 to December 15, 1984 or if possible to make the 30-day Credit Rule in Decision 82-12-079 a permanent part of tariff SDV 1-82.

For Authority to depart from the terms of Section 454 and 491 of the Public Utilities Code when accomplishing proposed publication.

### O P I N I O N

San Diego Van and Storage Company (San Diego) requests that the authority granted by Decision (D.) 82-12-079 be extended for an additional year or, if allowable, become a permanent part of San Diego's Commodity Tariff, SDVS 1-82, Cal. PUC 1-82.

D.82-12-079 in Application 82-02-17 authorized a 30-day credit rule covering transportation of trade shows, exhibits for conventions and specialized equipment for electronics companies. The authority granted by D.82-12-079 expired December 15, 1983.

Applicant states that one reason for the request for the extension of the 30-day credit rule is that approximately 30% of San Diego's accounts, who request transportation of trade shows, exhibits for conventions and specialized equipment for electronics companies, do not pay invoices within the usual seven days.

Additionally, applicant indicates that the 30-day credit rule will "allow us to conduct our business without being in violation of our tariff rules and regulations".

San Diego also states that they have been conducting business over the past year with the 30-day credit rule as previously authorized, and they have not encountered any problems nor experienced a competitive advantage as a result of the rule.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 27, 1984. No protest to the granting of the application has been received.

The proposal is not a major action significantly affecting energy efficiency within the meaning of Sections 3502.1 and 3502.2 of the Public Utilities (PU) Code.

Findings of Fact

1. The 30-day credit rule authorized by D.82-12-079 to December 15, 1984, has been shown to be justified.
2. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of highway common carriers.
3. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The application should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. San Diego Van & Storage Company is authorized a 30-day credit rule as originally authorized in D.82-12-079. This authority shall expire on December 15, 1984, unless cancelled or extended by the Commission.


2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed on or after the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than 5 days after the effective date of this order on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.
