In the Matter of the Application of Luke Stacker, doing business as American Charter Service, for a Class B charter bus certificate from home terminal in South San Francisco.

Application 84-01-30 (Filed January 12, 1984)

### OPINION

Luke Stacker, doing business as American Charter Service, requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers from a service area within 40 air miles of his home terminal at 332 North Canal Street, South San Francisco.

The application states as follows:

- Applicant has not previously been issued operating authority by the Commission. However, he has had over 13 years experience in the bus and jitney passenger transportation field.
- 2. Applicant is in the process of purchasing a 1972 reconditioned 47-passenger Eagle bus for the proposed service.
- 3. Applicant has surveyed various individuals and businesses regarding need for the proposed service. All have expressed an interest in using the personal and reliable service he would provide.
- 4. As of January 14, 1984, applicant had assets of \$222,950, liabilities of \$126,420, and a net worth of \$96,530. His estimated net income for the first year of operations under the proposed authority is \$79,312 before income taxes.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar of January 19, 1984. Because there is a

need for the proposed service and there has been no protest, the following order should be made effective on the date it is signed. Findings of Fact

1. Applicant has the ability, experience, and financial resources to perform the proposed service.

2. Public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant.

3. Applicant should be authorized to pick up passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from his home terminal at 332 North Canal Street, South San Francisco.

4. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusions of Law

1. Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and a certificate should be granted.

2. The following order should be made effective on the date signed.

# Q R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity to be renewed each year, is granted to applicant Luke Stacker authorizing him to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers, as defined in PU Code Section 5383, from a service area with a radius of 40 air miles from applicant's home terminal at 332 North Canal Street, South San Francisco.

- 2. Applicant shall:
  - a. Obtain California Highway Patrol (CHP) clearance for each vehicle to be used in this Class B charter-party operation.
  - b. Notify the Commission and CHP of any addition or deletion of vehicle(s) used in the service prior to use.

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c. Establish the authorized service within 360 days after this order is effective.

3. The Passenger Operations Branch will issue the annual renewable certificate on Form PE-695 as authorized by Resolution PE-303 when it receives CHP clearances and evidence of liability protection in compliance with General Order Series 115.

4. In providing service under the certificate, applicant shall comply with General Orders Series 98 and 115 and the CHP safety rules.

5. Prior to initiating service to any airport, the applicant shall notify the airport authority involved. This certificate does not authorize the holder to conduct any operations on the property of or into any airport unless such operation is authorized by both this Commission and the airport authority involved.

6. The Class B certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by this order does not authorize round-trip sightsceing-tour service, which is not subject to regulation by this Commission. It does, however, permit applicant to offer charter service to a sightseeing-tour operator.

The application is granted as set forth above.
