In the matter of the application of Santa Barbara Transportation Corporation for a Class B charter bus certificate from home terminal in Goleta.

Application 84-03-84 (Filed March 26, 1984)

<u>opinion</u>

Santa Barbara Transportation Corporation, a California corporation, has applied for a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers (Public Utilities (PU) Code Sections 5371 to 5375).

No other Commission operating authority has been held by applicant.

One of applicant's officers has eight years of experience in management and executive management in the transportation of passengers industry.

Applicant states that it intends to perform charter service for church groups, senior citizens groups, oil companies, and for the general public in Santa Barbara. Applicant anticipates increased demands for its service due to the 1984 Olympics.

Applicant's total assets are \$234,870; \$78,400 of this is attributable to applicant's four 14-passenger vans, one 12-passenger van, and three limousines. It is projected that a typical year's revenue mileage will be 7,200 miles producing charter revenues of \$42,000. Applicant's other operations will generate other revenues of \$546,000.

Notice of the filing of this application appeared in the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar of March 29, 1984. No protests have been received.

Findings of Fact

- 1. Applicant has the ability, experience, equipment, and financial resources to perform the proposed service.
- 2. Public convenience and necessity require the service proposed by applicant.
- 3. Applicant should be authorized to pick up passengers within a radius of 40 air miles from its home terminal at 7242 Hollister Avenue, Goleta.
- 4. No protest has been received and a public hearing is not necessary.
- 5. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

Conclusions of Law

- 1. Public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated and a certificate should be granted.
- 2. This order should become effective immediately as public convenience and necessity have been demonstrated.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity, to be renewed each year, is granted to Santa Barbara Transportation Corporation, authorizing it to operate as a Class B charter-party carrier of passengers, as defined in PU Code Section 5383, from a service area with a radius of 40 air miles from applicant's home terminal at 7242 Hollister Avenue, Goleta.

2. Applicant shall:

- a. Obtain California Highway Patrol (CHP) clearance for each vehicle to be used in this Class B charter-party operation.
- b. Notify the Commission and CHP of any addition or deletion of vehicle(s) used in the service prior to use.
- c. Establish the authorized service within 360 days after this order is effective.
- d. Remit to the Commission the Transportation Reimbursement Fee required by PU Code § 403 when notified by mail to do so.
- 3. The Passenger Operations Branch will issue the annual renewable certificate on Form PE-695 as authorized by Resolution PE-303 when it receives CEP clearances and evidence of liability protection in compliance with General Order Series 115.
- 4. In providing service under the certificate, applicant shall comply with General Orders Series 98 and 115 and the CHP safety rules.
- 5. Prior to initiating service to any airport, applicant shall notify the airport authority involved. This certificate does not authorize the holders to conduct any operations on the property of or into any airport unless such operation is authorized by both this Commission and the propert authority involved.
- 6. The Class B certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by this order does not authorize round-trip sightseeing-tour service, which is not subject to regulation by this Commission. It does, however, permit applicant to offer charter service to a sightseeing-tour operator.

7. The application is granted as set forth above.

This order is effective today.
