Monty T. Fross, an individual doing business as Fross Transfer Service, has applied for a dump truck carrier permit to authorize operation in the Counties of Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Merced, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Yolo. Notice of the filing appeared in the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar on March 15, 1984. No protests have been filed.

Applicant has held prior authority from this Commission as a highway contract carrier (T-130,481). Applicant will be transporting rock, sand, gravel, and asphalt, in two dump trucks. He will not engage subhaulers or lease equipment from employees.

Applicant has resided in the State of California continuously for 90 days next preceding the filing of this application.

Certificates supporting the application were filed by Claude E. Wood Co., and U.S. Rentals, Inc., of Lodi, California. These supporters will employ applicant to haul rock, sand, gravel, asphalt, and aggregates throughout the area he proposes to serve.

Applicant's balance sheet dated February 22, 1984, lists assets of \$262,000, liabilities of \$67,500, and a net worth of \$194,500.

Findings of Fact

1. Applicant:

- a. Is a fit and proper person to operate as a dump truck carrier.
- b. Has sufficient operating knowledge and financial ability to initiate and continue the proposed operation.
- c. Has demonstrated that the privilege sought:
 - (1) Will not endanger the safety of the public or interfere with the public use of the public highways or impair the condition or maintenance of them, directly or indirectly.
 - (2) Will not unnecessarily burden the public highways.
 - (3) Is necessary to serve the public and will not impair the ability of presently permitted dump truck carriers to provide adequate service at the lowest possible reasonable rates.

2. Applicant has resided continuously in California for at least 90 days preceding the filing of the application.

3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

4. The following order complies with the Commission's Energy Efficiency Plan.

5. A public hearing is not necessary. Conclusions of Law

1. Applicant should be granted a dump truck carrier permit authorizing operations within and between points in the Counties of Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Merced, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Yolo.

2. The following order should be effective today to be consistent with the grant of other types of permits.
