Application of Trucking Unlimited under Shortened Procedure Tariff Docket to issue a revised page to its 4th revised adoption notice which will add a new bulky freight minimum charge item which will result in increases.

Shortened Procedure Tariff Docket Application 84-07-052 (Filed July 16, 1984)

<u>opinion</u>

By this application, Trucking Unlimited (Trucking), a highway common carrier, seeks authority to publish an exception to its adoption of the Commission's Transition Tariff 2 to provide an increased level of minimum charges for bulky freight.

Trucking states that neither the classification nor the provisions of Transition Tariff 2 provide adequate revenue for bulky shipments which occupy an excessive amount of space when compared to the weight being shipped. Applicant proposes to publish a new item (No. 150-1) in its 4th Revised Adoption Notice which provides increased minimum charges for such freight based on the lineal feet of loading space utilized.

Trucking certifies that the proposed increases will not increase its California intrastate gross revenue by as much as one percent.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar of July 23, 1984. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

Findings of Fact

- 1. The increases resulting from this proposal are justified.
- 2. The proposal will increase applicant's California intrastate gross revenue by less than one percent.
- 3. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of highway carriers.
 - 4. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Trucking Unlimited is authorized to publish new Item
 150-1 applicable to bulky freight in its 4th Revised Adoption
 Notice as specifically set forth in Exhibit A of the application.
- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed on or after the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than 5 days after the effective date of this order on not less than 5 day's notice to the Commission.

3. The application is granted as set forth above.
