Decision 84 10 015 OCT 3 1984

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of the Statewide Delivery, Cal T-101547 for permission to publish in its local tariffs provisions limiting liability for loss and damage in connection with shipments of electro-mechanical devices including electronic products pursuant to Sections 486 thru 495 of the Public Utilities Code.

O P I N I O N

By this application, Statewide Delivery, Cal T-101,547 (Statewide), seeks authority to add an item regarding released value provisions to its individual tariffs SWDO 210, Cal PUC-1 and SWDO 220, Cal PUC-2. The provisions of the new item define the carrier's liability limitations and permit shippers to declare higher valuations on their shipments by paying an added charge.

Applicant states that the proposal, if granted, would increase its California intrastate gross revenue by less than 1%.

Applicant indicates that the proposal is not considered to be a major action significantly affecting energy efficiency within the meaning of Public Utilities (PU) Code Sections 3502.1 and 3502.2.

The application and amendment were listed on the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendars of June 27 and August 15, 1984. No protest to the application has been received.

Findings of Fact

1. The increases resulting from this proposal are justified.
2. The proposal will result in increasing applicant's California intrastate gross revenue by less than one percent.
3. The following order has no reasonably foreseeable impact on the energy efficiency of highway carriers.
4. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The application, as amended, should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

Statewide Delivery is authorized to publish a new item providing for released valuation in tariffs SWDO 210, Cal PUC-1 and SWDO 220, Cal PUC-2.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of this order shall be filed on or after the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than 5 days after the effective date of this order on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and to the public.


3. The application, as amended, is granted as set forth above.
