ORDER EXTENDING TIMEStatement of Facts

Suspensions of the tariff filed by Advice Letter No. 200, and of a deviation to the Standard Main Extension Contract proposed by Advice Letter No. 198, of San Jose Water Company, were for periods to expire November 13, 1987 and December 10, 1987, respectively.

Duly noticed public hearing on the two suspensions was held in Saratoga, California before Administrative Law Judge John B. Weiss the evening of October 22, 1987. At the conclusion of the hearing the matters were submitted. Additional time will be required after the expiration of the suspension dates for rendering of decisions on these matters.

Notice of these matters did not appear in the Commission's public agenda; however, an emergency exists in that unless extended, the suspensions will terminate before a decision can be issued. This justifies our action today under Public Utilities Code Section 306(b).

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that the suspensions ordered in (I&S) Case (C.) 87-07-002 and C.87-09-010 shall continue until May 13, 1988 and June 10, 1988, respectively, or further order of the Commission, whichever occurs earlier.

This order is effective today.
