<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Applied Industrial Materials Corporation (Aimcor) has applied for authority to amend Item 70(b) of Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A and page 5 of "Commodities and Geographic Areas Exempt from Rate Regulation" to substitute the corporate name Aimcor in place of International Minerals and Chemical Corporation (IMC).

The carbon, minerals, and chemical division of IMC were transferred to IMC Industry Group, which became Aimcor about November 3, 1986. The facilities, activities, equipment, and managerial personnel of IMC were also transferred and now are part of Aimcor.

Notice of the filing of the application was published in the Commission's Daily Transportation Calendar of February 29, 1988 and there have been no protests or requests for hearing. A grant of this application will merely authorize the substitution of names.

Findings of Fact

1. Applied Industrial Materials Corporation has requested that its name be added to Item 70(b) of Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A and page 5 of "Commodities and Geographic Areas Exempt from Rate Regulation" in place of International Materials and Chemical Corporation. C.5437 Pet. 336 ALJ/EGF/jc

2. All facilities and operating personnel of the latter corporation have been transferred to the former organization.

3. Granting this application will have no effect other than to change the names as indicated.

4. The change of names is not adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The petition should be granted as set forth in the following order.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A (Appendix B to D.82061, as amended) is further amended by incorporating Sixteenth Revised Page 10 and Sixteenth Revised Page 11, attached, to become effective 39 days after today.

2. The document "Commodities and Geographic Areas Exempt from Rate Regulation" is amended by incorporating Fourth Revised Page 5, attached, to become effective 39 days after today.

3. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be made effective not earlier than 39 days after today, and may be made effective on not less than 5 days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than 60 days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. In all other respects D.82061, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

5. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carrier's authorized tariff publishing agent, performing transportation services subject to Minimum Rate Tariff 7-A, and on each subscriber to MRT 7-A.

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6. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the revision to the list of Commodities and Geographic Areas Exempt from Rate Regulation on each highway common carrier and each highway contract carrier.

7. The petition is granted.
