<u>OPINION</u>

This complaint, supported by the signatures of more than 25 customers of defendant, challenges the reasonableness of the \$5.00 monthly minimum electric charge established in Decision (D.) 86-12-091 in Application 86-04-012.

Defendant Pacific Gas and Electric Company answered and moved to dismiss on the grounds that D.86-12-091 had found the charge reasonable and was now final.

A prehearing conference was held on April 1, 1988. During the conference, a staff representative explained the process of rate design to complainant. It was decided that hearing should be postponed to allow complainant to consider and investigate a different approach, one which did not directly challenge the finding that the charge was reasonable.

On November 16 the assigned Administrative Law Judge wrote to complainant, inquiring about his readiness to proceed to hearing. No answer has been received. Since complainant has failed to move for hearing, this complaint should be dismissed for want of prosecution.
