OPINION

California Dump Truck Owners Association (petitioner) is a California corporation with a membership of 1,600 permitted carriers. A copy of its Articles of Incorporation is on file with the Commission as required by Rule 16 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

Petitioner has filed to request that Minimum Rate Tariff (MRT) 7-A be amended by the addition of two new proposed items.

MRT 7-A presently sets forth zone hauling rates in various parts of the state including zone rates for rock, sand, and asphaltic concrete in the Antelope Valley area of Southern California.

These rates are based on operating costs determined some 30 years ago. Since that time the Commission and the industry have worked together to update the rate levels.

In the interim, dump truck technology has advanced and some types of dump trucks now in use are the most efficient for certain types of hauling. Rates which have been augmented to reflect the increase in costs are available to those carriers who operate under the distance rates in MRT 17-A and MRT 7-A, but are not available to the MRT 7-A zone haulers in the Antelope Valley area of Los Angeles County.

Carriers who charge zone rates for Antelope Valley hauling are therefore not adequately compensated when they are using special high cost dump truck equipment. This petition was filed to conform the Antelope Valley zone rates with the MRT 17-A and MRT 7-A distance rates, which already reflect differences in equipment costs.

The Commission's Transportation Division has recommended that the application be granted.

Copies of the application and the amendment were mailed to the Associated General Contractors of California, Associated Independent Owner Operators, Inc., California Carriers Association, California Asphalt Pavement Association, Southern California Rock Products Association, and the Department of Transportation of the State of California. Notice of the filing of the application appeared in the Commission's Transportation Calendar on May 25 and August 24, 1989. There have been no protests or requests for hearing.

Findings of Fact

- 1. Distance and zone rates listed in MRT 17-A and the distance rates in MRT 7-A have been augmented to cover the use of high cost dump truck equipment.
- 2. Zone rates for carriers operating out of Antelope Valley (Los Angeles County) have not been sufficiently increased to cover the use of special high cost dump truck equipment.
- 3. Antelope Valley carriers who charge zone rates and operate special dump truck equipment have therefore been required to charge rates which do not provide an adequate return.
- 4. The rates proposed herein are just and reasonable and will enable the Antelope Valley dump truck haulers charging zone rates to achieve parity with carriers charging the augmented rates.
 - 5. The application has not been protested.
 - A public hearing is not necessary.

Conclusion of Law

The petition should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. MRT 7-A (Appendix B to Decision (D.) 82061 as amended) is further amended by incorporating the revised pages shown in Appendix A, to become effective 30 days after today.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to D.82061, as amended, are directed to establish in their tariffs the increases and reductions necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered by this decision.
- 3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of this order shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the effective date of the tariff pages attached.
- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized by this order, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Public Utilities Code § 461.5 to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are modified to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects, D.82061, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

- 6. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on every common carrier, or such carrier's authorized tariff publishing agent, performing transportation services subject to MRT 7-A.
- 7. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of this decision on each subscriber to MRT 7-A.

This order becomes effective 30 days from today.

RULES GOVERNING BOUNDARY DESCRIPTIONS Rules applicable to the descriptions of boundaries of Delivery Zones and Production Areas contained in this section

Where streets, railway lines, rights of way railway companies and water courses are used to define boundaries or are used as the line or point from which boundaries are measured, the center line of such streets, railway lines, rights of way and water courses will constitute the definite boundary line or the definite line or point from which boundaries are measured. Where such a street is divided, the center line of the dividing strip will constitute the definite boundary line or the line or point from which boundaries are measured.

(Applies only in connection with descriptions of Antelope Valley Production Area and Delivery Zones appearing on Pages 53 to 74, inclusive.) Where streets and highways, in connection with Antelope Valley, are used to describe zone boundaries, the words "and extension thereof" will be considered as inherent in the description whenever appropriate for the purpose of completing closure of a zone.

(1) 470 Unless otherwise noted, where a street is named as a boundary line which has an offset at any intersecting street, and carries the same name at either side of the offset, such portion of the intersecting street encompassed in the offset will become a part of such boundary line.

The term "street" as used above will be synonymous with "avenue", "boulevard", "drive", "lane", "terrace", "road" or other designations thereof.

where the term "shoreline" is employed as a boundary line, such boundary lines shall be construed to embrace any pier or wharf extending into the adjacent body of water.

Where the terms "north", "west", "south" and "east" are used on a course in the following descriptions, they are referenced to the true meridian and indicative of a true direction.

The term "parattet" as used herein denotes an equidistant course with relation to the line referred to whether said line is straight or curved.

Where section lines are employed in Southern Territory they are in each instance referenced to the San Bernardino Base and Meridian; in Northern Territory they are referenced to Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

At the beginning of Northern Territory boundary descriptions a name is shown for convenience in referring to the zone or area. This name may also be the name of a city, community, street or other feature; but it is not to be construed as extending the boundaries beyond those which follow the name.
