SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

A decision dated today in this proceeding ordered that rates and charges in Minimum Rate Tariff (MRT) 17-A be subject to a surcharge of 1.3% for a period of two years and that a permanent new tariff item consisting of a \$2.50 charge per cargo box be included to recover the costs incurred in compliance with Vehicle Code Section 23114 as amended by Assembly Bill 3220 (Katz), Chapter 1486, stats. 1988. Amendment of the tariff is accomplished by this order.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. MRT 17-A (Appendix C to Decision (D.) 80578, as amended) is further amended by incorporating Supplement 44, Twelfth Revised Page iii, and Fourth Revised Page 1-21, attached, to become effective 30 days from today.

2. MRT 17-A is further amended to include new item #570 for recovery of the costs of tarping in the amount of \$2.50 per cargo box.

3. In all other respects D.80578, as amended shall remain in full force and effect.


4. The Executive Director shall serve a copy of the tariff amendments on each subscriber to MRT 17-A.

## (E) ◇ APPLICATION OF SURCHARGE

Except as otherwise provided, compute the amount of charges in accordance with the rates and rules of this tariff, and increase the amount so computed as follows:  
(SEE EXCEPTION)

1. By one and three-tenths (1.3) percent on commodities named in Items 60, 70 and 75 except for the transportation of commodities in permanent enclosed hoppers.
2. By eight-tenths (0.8) percent for the transportation of commodities described in Item 65 and commodities in permanent enclosed hoppers.

For purposes of disposing of fractions under provisions hereof, fractions of less than one-half (1/2) cent shall be dropped and fractions of one-half (1/2) cent or greater shall be increased to the next higher whole cent.

EXCEPTION: The surcharge herein shall not apply to:

1. Paragraphs (b) and (c) in Item 120 - Application of Tariff-Rates;
2. Item 170 - Accessorial Charges (At Origin);
3. The additional charge in Item 180 when transportation is performed in 4- and 5-axle equipment - Accessorial Charges (At Destination);
4. Items 200 and 220 (Railhead-to-railhead charges only); and
5. Item 280 - Collect on Delivery (C.O.D.) Shipment.

<p align="center"><b>(1) UNLOADING AND SPREADING SERVICE</b></p> <p>When a carrier performs unloading and spreading service by spreader box which the carrier pushes or pulls, a charge of \$1.70 per load, or fraction thereof, shall apply in addition to the charges otherwise applicable under this tariff.</p> <p>When a carrier moves a push or pull spreader box from one location to another at the same job site in a movement which is other than that by which the carrier is concurrently performing an unloading and spreading service, a charge of \$5.20 per movement shall apply in addition to the charges otherwise applicable under this tariff.</p> <p>The carrier shall not perform unloading and spreading service by spreader box which it pushes or pulls, nor shall it otherwise move such a spreader box from one location to another at a job site, unless it has been first given a written order for said services, which order has been signed by the party (or authorized representative) who assumes the responsibility for the payment of the applicable charges.</p> <p>(1) Will not apply to the transportation of commodities as described in Item 65 of this tariff.</p>	560
