ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Ordering Paragraph One of Decision (D.) 91433 dated March 18, 1980 as extended by D.93787 dated December 1, 1981 and further extended by D.84-05-060 dated May 16, 1984, D.85-06-010 dated June 5, 1985, and D.87-05-044 dated May 29, 1987, Southern California Edison Company (Edison) was authorized to issue short-term notes in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$441,288,502 beyond that authorized by Public Utilities Code Section 823(c). This authority expired June 30, 1990.

By Petition for Modification of Decision 91433, filed June 6, 1990, and appearing on the Commission Daily Calendar on June 13, 1990 Edison requests another extension of time until June 30, 1993. No protests have been received to date, and with good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Southern California Edison Company may issue short-term notes in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$441,288,502 beyond that authorized by Public Utilities Code Section 823(c) as authorized by Decision (D.)91433 dated March 18, 1980 as extended by D.93787, D.84-05-060, D.85-06-010, and D.87-05-044 dated December 1, 1981, May 16, 1984, June 5, 1985, and May 29, 1987, respectively, in the above-entitled matter and is hereby extended to June 30, 1993.


2. This extension of time is granted as set forth above.
