In the Matter of the Application of AALERT PAGING COMPANY OF SAN DIEGO, (U-2086-C), a California corporation, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct additional Radiotelephone Utility Facility pursuant to Section 1001 of the Public Utilities Code.

## OPINION

AAlert Paging Company of San Diego (applicant) holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a radiotelephone utility. It now provides one-way paging services from north of Santa Barbara to the Mexican border. It seeks authority to expand its service area by constructing new antennas on Tepusquet Peak, 13 miles east of Santa Maria and on Tassajera Peak, 5 miles north of San Luis Obispo.

The cost of the facilities will be \$125,000. Applicant's parent, AAlert Paging Company, has guaranteed all required funding. The parent is a subsidiary of Citizens Utility Company.

Both antennas will be installed at existing antenna sites.

Notice of the application was accomplished by publication in the Commission's Daily Calendar on June 15, 1990. No protests have been received.

### Findings of Fact

- 1. No protests have been received.
- 2. Public convenience and necessity require the proposed service area expansion.
- 3. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment.

# Conclusions of Law

- 1. No hearing is required.
- 2. The application should be granted.
- 3. Since this order is not controversial, it should be effective today.

## ORDBR

#### IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is issued to AAlert Paging Company of San Diego for the construction and operation of the antenna facility as specified in the application.
- 2. Within 30 days after this order is effective, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate granted in this proceeding.
- 3. The certificate granted and the authority to render service under the rates, charges, and rules authorized will expire if not exercised within 12 months after the effective date of this order.

4. After the effective date of this order, AAlert Paging Company of San Diego shall file revised tariffs and service area maps in compliance with General Order Series 96, and apply its present tariffs to the areas certificated by this order. The effective date of these tariffs shall be 5 days after filing.

This order is effective today.
