ORDER MODIFYING DECISION 90-03-012

On August 21, 1990, Paging Dimensions, Inc. (petitioner) filed its Petition to Modify Decision (D.) 90-03-012. In that decision signed March 14, 1990 and effective April 13, 1990, we granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPC&N) to provide one-way paging service as a radiotelephone utility (RTU) in Orange, Los Angeles, Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura, and San Diego Counties.

In Ordering Paragraph 11 of D.90-03-012, we provided that the certificate granted would expire 120 days from the effective date of that decision unless petitioner demonstrated that it had obtained Federal Communications Commission (FCC) construction permits for three paging sites located near Corona, Chatsworth, and Los Angeles. Through no fault of petitioner, the FCC did not issue the required authority and, accordingly, the CPC&N expired on August 13, 1990.

Petitioner requests that D.90-03-013 be modified to allow additional time to meet the requirements of Ordering Paragraph 11. Notice of the Petition to Modify appeared in the Commission's Daily Calendar on August 23, 1990. No protests have been received.

Because petitioner was unable to comply with the terms of Ordering Paragraph 11 through no fault of its own, and because the granting of this petition will not prejudice any party,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Ordering Paragraph 11 in D.90-03-012 is modified to read:

"11. The certificate granted and the authority to render service under the rates, charges, and rules authorized shall expire if applicant has not complied with Order Paragraph 2 of this decision within 12 months of the effective date of this order. The certificate and authority to render service shall also expire unless they are exercised within 12 months of the date on which applicant has complied with Ordering Paragraph 2."


2. In all other respects, D.90-03-012 shall remain as adopted on March 14, 1990.
