<u>OPINION</u>

Quynlark M. Patton (Patton) complains that Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has billed her for utility service without providing an explanation of the bill.

On May 4, 1992, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) assigned to this case issued the following ruling:

"This case, scheduled for hearing on April 20, 1992, was taken off calendar as the pleadings do not show what facts are in dispute. The complaint requests explanation of an additional bill, and Consumer Affairs' letters attached to the complaint show that a full explanation of the additional bill was given by defendant. It is unclear whether complainant lived at 9509 Olive Street, #A, in Oakland, or whether the delinguency at that address was for utility services rendered to her.

"Complainant should be allowed to amend her complaint to set forth facts showing that she is not responsible for the billing in disputé. Accordingly,

"IT IS RULED that Quynlark M. Patton has until June 1, 1992 to amend her complaint so as to completely advise the defendant and the Commission of the facts constituting the grounds of the complaint, the injury complained of, and the exact relief which is desired (Rule 10, Rules of Practice and Procedure)."

Patton has not filed an amendment to her complaint and has not otherwise communicated with the ALJ. Accordingly, the complaint should be dismissed as not having been prosecuted with reasonable diligence.
